FROM MICHELLE FOX, FOUNDER & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2022 was a big and rich year for TreeSong. Looking back I am amazed at all the growth that took place in just one year. We continued with our popular online programming featuring naturalist and arts classes, through which we reached folks all over the country, and even the world! This is something I never would have envisioned pre-Covid. It's been wonderful to connect with people from British Columbia, Arizona, New York and even Germany, Ireland, and Japan. We offered a robust lineup of in-person experiences as well, including Wildlife Tracking weekends, Forest Bathing Walks, Birding Field Trips, ceramics/mixed media classes, and Cold Wax classes.

Our children's programs were strong in 2022. Our monthly Circle Keepers nature immersion program (which has been running since TreeSong began in 2013) continued, as did our summer day camps. Our weekly homeschool program evolved into our Forest School which has been an absolute delight!

A notable and truly exciting addition to the TreeSong campus was a 30-foot yurt that we erected in August. Our generous community came together and, over the course of three weekends, built this gorgeous space. It serves mostly as a classroom for Forest School but will be used for weekend classes and community events as well. When I reflect on the yurt, I see that it serves as a symbol for what has fueled TreeSong from its inception — generosity, connection, community, determination, love, and a strong belief in creating a place for people to grow, learn, and thrive. So many people had a hand (and heart!) in bringing our longtime dream of a yurt to fruition. My gratitude is boundless.

Our arts committee launched our Small Art for Big Hearts project, engaging local artists in creating small works of art which were then sold to raise funds for the yurt. Thank you to those who contributed!

And thank you to all the incredible instructors, employees, volunteers, class participants, students, families, donors, and community partners that made 2022 a truly stellar year.
